



An InterWrite PRS Tech Tip

—The PowerPoint PRS Add-in Utility—

How it works

When InterWrite PRS is installed, it adds a PRS Toolbar to Microsoft PowerPoint for Windows. The addition of the PRS Toolbar to PowerPoint makes it possible to turn any slide in a PowerPoint Slide Show into a **PRS Question Slide** and the Slide Show into a **PRS Session**.

The InterWrite PRS Add-in must be *registered* on the system on which it is installed. The registration of the PRS Add-in must be done by a user with *Administrator* privileges. Because the installation of the InterWrite PRS software must be performed by a user logged in with *Administrator* privileges, the registration of the PRS Add-in is automatic, as part of the software installation. In addition, the registration of the PRS Add-in applies to all future log-ins of this user. However, all other users who login to that system must register using **PowerPoint PRS Add-in** from **Start/Programs/InterWrite PRS**.

The PRS Add-in works with PowerPoint 2000 or newer.

The Problem

If you had an older version of PowerPoint and updated to a newer version of Microsoft Office (2000, 2003, XP), the PRS Add-in does not work, even if you use the **PowerPoint PRS Add-in** to register the application. An *Administrator* must download and run a new version of the **PowerPoint PRS Add-in** utility from the GTCO CalComp Website at www.gtccalcomp.com/supportprstroubleshooting.htm, or click on this **PowerPoint PRS Add-in** link to download the executable now.

Once the **PowerPoint PRS Add-in** utility is registered, the PRS Toolbar will appear in PowerPoint. As indicated above, each additional user who logs in to the system must run the registration utility.
